MISSION

Impact100 DC is an all-volunteer women's philanthropic community dedicated to improving lives in the Greater Washington, DC area by collectively funding transformational grants to local nonprofit organizations.

VISION

- To address unmet needs in our community, prioritizing those that result from systemic racism and structural inequity;
- To create and sustain a diverse community of dynamic women committed to building bridges across the wide demographic divides in the Washington DC area; and
- To empower women as philanthropists and leaders.



- The annual \$1,000 donation of each Impact100 DC member goes exclusively to funding our grant. We rely on "Member Plus" 110% contributions as well as Friends of Impact100 DC donations to pay operating costs.
- Membership is open to all women over the age of 21 and renewable annually.
- Impact100 DC accepts applications from nonprofits in the District of Columbia, Montgomery, Prince George's, Fairfax, and Arlington Counties, and the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, and Falls Church. 501(c)(3) nonprofits, except those organizations whose primary purpose and use of grant funds is for religious or political activities or do not meet our operating budget criteria (\$300K \$5M), are eligible to apply.
- Focus Area Committee members review applications and nominate finalists to move forward for membership vote.
- Each member casts one vote.
- The Impact100 DC model was founded by Wendy Steele in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 2001. Today, Impact100 DC is part of a fast-growing global network of over 60 chapters in the US and beyond, which have collectively raised more than \$90 million.

Letter from the President

November 30, 2023

Dear Impact100 DC Members,

This past year, with your support, 164 members awarded \$162,000 to four nonprofit organizations working to effect change, bring our total grant awards since 2021 to over \$400,000.

We are poised to begin our fourth year of grantmaking!

The mission and vision we created in 2020 continues to serve as our north star. Principles of equity are embedded in every decision we make and every action we take. Our grantees are all focusing on addressing needs whose roots lie in systemic inequity, reflecting the racial equity lens at the center of our grantmaking. We continue to revise our application, grant evaluation, and reporting processes bearing in mind the burdens on smaller nonprofit organizations. The first half of our 2023 Board Retreat this past September focused on principles and implications of trust-based philanthropy, part of an ongoing review and evaluation of our grantmaking processes.

Impact100 DC is led by a talented, diverse, hardworking, and committed Board of 20 women. A number of Board members have continued to serve since our inception in 2020. One of the most important tasks ahead of us is building a robust leadership pipeline for each Board position. As we look for ways to identify future leaders, please do not be shy about reaching out to me should you have an interest in participating at that level.

Our organization has grown from 107 members in our founding year, to 138 in 2022, to 164 in 2023. We are entering a new phase of the organization -- on a growth trajectory, and neither fully new nor fully seasoned. We have determined that this is just the right time to create our first three year strategic plan. To that end, we are partnering with Spur Local, formerly the Catalogue for Philanthropy, to guide us in this first effort and help ensure a comprehensive and action-oriented plan that will point us toward the future.

On behalf of the Impact100 DC Board, thank you to ALL our members and friends whose donations of time and resources have helped build and continue to sustain this organization. I am so proud to be a part of this wonderful community of women.

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Commitment to Equity

We are committed to prioritizing diversity, equity, and inclusion and embedding those values in all aspects of our organization and decision-making. We are committed to creating and sustaining board and membership diversity so that Impact100 DC as an organization has the ability to analyze problems and solutions from a myriad of perspectives and lived experiences. We seek to create opportunities for members to come together and learn from each other, and to build meaningful relationships with the nonprofit organizations we support with our grants.

We are committed to educating ourselves and being conversant about the root causes and consequences of institutional inequity within systems of power (such as places of employment, government agencies and social services). Unconscious bias exists, and it privileges some and disadvantages others. We believe it's important for our members to know and understand this.

We are committed to grantmaking through an equity lens as an intentional way of distributing philanthropic support to programs that make life fairer for *the people* who have suffered as a result of systemic inequity and disadvantage. Equally important, we believe it is imperative to support efforts to reshape the *institutions* built upon privilege and power -- such as our medical establishment and public schools -- that continue to produce wildly disparate outcomes for certain groups within our community.

This approach to grantmaking and membership is one of the most important ways we can follow through on our mission and vision.



^{*}Impact100 DC is a 12/31 calendar yearend entity. Condensed financial information presented, actual from 1/1/2023 - 7/31/2023. Grant funds are generally paid to grantee, 50% in year 1 and remaining 50% in year 2. Fellowship income is restricted to sponsor fellowship members and is not available for operating costs.



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Grant Timeline & Focus Areas







Arts & Culture

Includes projects that foster greater exposure to or participation in the arts, expand arts education, or use art as a medium for creative expression. Priority will be given to programs that target residents in underserved communities that have lacked access to quality arts programs.



Education

Includes projects that expand or improve learning opportunities for students who lack access to a quality education, including projects focused on improving early childhood education, language and literacy skills training, and tutoring and mentoring, as well as programs providing high school graduation rates and/or enrollment in higher education, especially for populations that have experienced systemic racism or discrimination.



Environment

Includes projects that focus on improving or preserving the natural and built environments, including places that experience a disproportionate amount of pollution as a result of heavy industry, or that lack access to clean air and water, natural resources, and green spaces. Also includes projects that address neighborhood crime and violence.



Ř Family

Includes projects that support the lives of individuals, children, families, and seniors, especially but not limited to immigrant communities and people of color who have been the subject of systemic racism, focusing on housing, living wage, food insecurity, job skills training, and other basic needs.



Health & Wellness

Includes projects that address access to health care and seek to improve the physical or mental health of people who experience discrimination, including people of color, the disabled, and incarcerated individuals, as well as projects that foster healthy living habits and holistic wellness.



Fellowship Program

Building bridges to membership



The Impact100 DC Fellowship program advances our commitment to building a community with diverse voices and perspectives by providing a path to women ages 21-39 who are interested in philanthropy but currently lack the financial resources to join us. Impact100 DC fellows contribute to our mission in a variety of ways - from serving on our grant review committees to amplifying our outreach to helping organize events. Fellows benefit from hands-on experience with philanthropic work as they participate in the full range of activities alongside other Impact100 DC members.

Begun in our first year with one fellow, the program is thriving. With two fellows in 2022, five in 2023, and eight as we move into 2024, this program is poised to continue growing. Under the leadership of Martha Coven, the Fellowship Committee is working this year to identify ways to enhance the experience for fellows, including by providing additional opportunities for networking with other fellows and members.
